2010 IN REVIEW: ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- ◆ Using **Montana Cultural Trust C&A Grant** (\$8,400 over two years) we continued the office (moved to Jacobs House) and a quarter-time Public Relations Coordinator
- ◆ CPR awarded \$3,650 in **Historic Improvement Program grants** to 6 property owners
- ◆ Successful **Brick Workshop**
- ◆ Successful **Dust to Dazzle tour**
- ◆ **Facebook page** started in January; 239 fans at year-end. Most of them are non-members, so this is a good way to contact more people.
- ◆ Started using **VerticalResponse** for e-mail contacts (a free service).
- ◆ **Protect-a-Gate** program continues
- ◆ **Two Salvage Sales** raised about \$2,500



Stabilizing the Greek Café was the focus of CPR efforts in 2010, led by Nicole von Gaza. During the year, a \$30,000 Challenge Cost Share grant from the National Park Service was confirmed, and the NPS indicated that our application was the best in the region. Our application to the Montana Department of Commerce for a share in the Federal Stimulus money set aside by the legislature for historic preservation resulted in the Greek Café project winning approval for \$44,750, one of five in Butte and one of about 40 statewide, of 135 applications. We also received a pledge from BSB's Urban Revitalization Agency, with concurrence of the Council of Commissioners, for an additional \$94,000 for the project.

On January 24, 2011, the project was offered by Butte-Silver Bow through the Developer's Packet process; cost \$5,000. Our web page for the project is at

WHAT YOUR MEMBERSHIP AND DONATIONS MAKE POSSIBLE

The shortfalls in the Cultural Trust Grants we have used for partial operational support (our office, among other things) means we have only about \$6,700 over two years (2009-11) rather than the \$10,000 originally requested. Grants for the 2011-13 cycle will likewise be reduced, perhaps significantly. CPR has maintained an office since 2008, first in the Butte Arts Foundation building (old YMCA) and then the Jacobs House. To accommodate our decrease in grant funding, and because the office was visited rarely by members, we decided to close the rented office in January 2011. By no longer having the office, phone, and internet connection we expect to save close to \$2,000 a year which can be used more directly in our programs such as tours, HIP grants, and educational publications and workshops. Meetings will take place at members' homes or elsewhere, as they did before 2008.

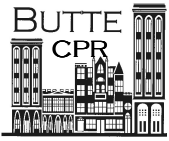
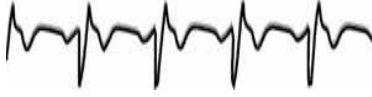
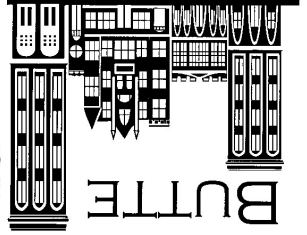
