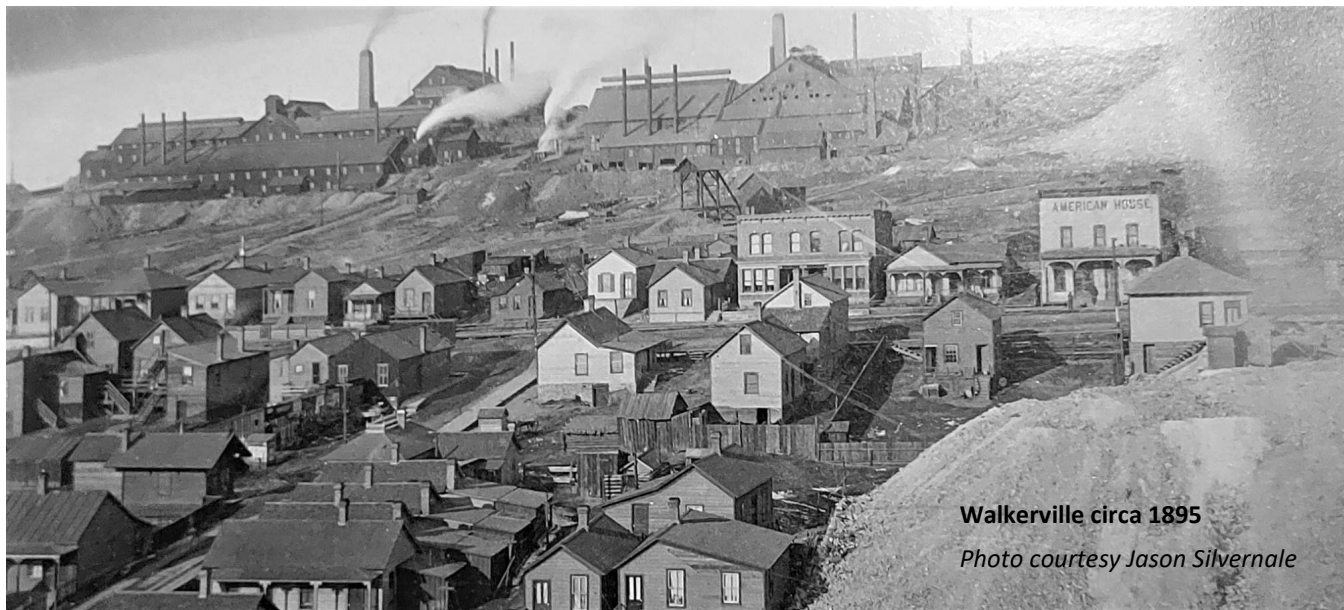


DUST to DAZZLE 2023—Walk Walkerville

Mark your calendars: the 2023 Dust to Dazzle Tour is scheduled for Saturday, June 24th from noon to 5:00. This year's tour will focus on historic Walkerville.

Some of the highlights of the tour:

- ◆ An early mercantile store turned church, now being brought back as a store.
- ◆ A brick duplex built by a doctor in the early 1890s.
- ◆ Butte's second-oldest Catholic church, now owned by the City of Walkerville.
- ◆ The Lexington Mine hoist house.
- ◆ Four residences, ranging from the humble to the middle-class to the grand.

2022 in REVIEW

It was a wildly busy year for Butte CPR. Our most recent endeavor, the *Story of Butte* website/app was successfully launched and new stories and tours continue to be added. You can learn more about Butte's buildings and their history from the comfort of your home computer; but even better, you can download the app onto your phone and the map-based program can see where you are and tell about the histories of nearby buildings and take you on historic tours. If you haven't tried it yet, see the QR code on page 3 of this newsletter. It won't disappoint!

Our second major project of 2022 has been the revitalization of a historic house on Jackson Street through our Butte Historic Trust. Major stabilization work has been done to ensure this home's future. Windows, doors, electrical and plumbing are in process. Hopefully by summer's end the house will be sold with the profits being recycled into another endangered property.

Our Dust to Dazzle fundraising tour in 2022 was one of our most financially successful ever, which means that we will be able to support more Historic Improvement grants this year. With renovation costs continuing to rise, Butte CPR has raised its maximum grant amount to \$3000 this year. Many thanks to all who support Dust to Dazzle by purchasing tickets or by volunteering, which makes it all possible.
